Dr Julia Jabour is leader of the Ocean & Antarctic Governance Research Program at Institute for Marine and Antarctic Studies (IMAS), University of Tasmania. She has been researching, writing and lecturing on polar governance for more than 20 years. Most of her teaching and research is trans-disciplinary, combining law, policy and international relations. Julia has visited Antarctica six times, and been an observer on the Australian delegation at Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meetings on a number of occasions. Julia has had teaching assignments in Iceland, Malaysia, Vietnam and New Zealand. She was a SCOR Visiting Scholar to Iran in 2017. Julia is a visiting professor at GSICS (June 30 – August 3, 2018) and teaches an intensive course “The Long-Peace in Antarctica”.
