Structure of studies	First-cycle studies are dedicated for those who complete secondary school and want to obtain Bachelor's degree. Duration is 3 to 3,5 years.
	Second-cycle studies are dedicated to Bachelor's degree holders. Duration is 1,5 to 2 years.
	In the some fields of study there are long-cycle studies (e.g. Medicine, Law, Art conservation and restoration), which duration is 6 years. Completing this cycle students obtain Master's degree and it is equal in terms of qualification the Master's degree at the second-cycle studies.
	Third-cycle studies (PhD studies) are designed for those who are interested in research and science. Duration is 4 years.
ECTS Credits	Nicolaus Copernicus University follows ECTS scheme (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System), which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty.
	To complete successfully year of study, students are obliged to collect 60 ECTS credits (30 credits per semester).
Grading scale	The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.
	Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain zal. or zaliczenie which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
