Abstract

Arctic fish dynamics under the climate change trigger the negotiations firstly among five Arctic Ocean Coastal States (A5) and then among A5 and other five important distant fishing entities with interest in Central Arctic Ocean (CAO) fishery, with a view to reaching an agreement to regulate CAO fishery in the light of precautionary approach. A careful look into both A5 and A5+5 process will reveal the divergence between Arctic and non-Arctic States as well as the advancement made for the Arctic marine sustainability. Although the legally binding CAO fishery agreement is almost finalized for signature, further challenges for Arctic fishery regime-building still need to be addressed.

Leilei Zou is a post-doctoral research fellow at PCRC of Kobe University. Her research interest is marine policies and laws, with polar living resources conservation as the research priority. Themes for her most published papers are concerned with Arctic fishery legal order making, the role of non-Arctic States in Arctic fishery regime-build, and CCAMLR measures for Antarctic marine living resources conservation.

Dr Leilei Zou has working experiences in multi-cultural communities. She has worked as the researcher at OECD in France and Law School at University of Virginia in the USA.
