Academic Load	Kobe University does not have a full-time load. 124 credits or more are necessary to complete an undergraduate program (Bachelor degree) at Kobe University (approx. 30 credits/year). Maximum load per semester depends on each faculty, and there is no minimum load. However, all international students including exchange students must take at least 10 lesson hours (equivalent to 6-7 classes) per week in accordance with immigration law.
Class Types and Schedules	Classes include lectures, seminars, experiments, exercises, and practical training. We will offer classes according to patterns I - III described below. Patterns I and II are "quarter classes", and pattern III takes the "semester class" format. Please see the syllabus for further information about each class. I) 1 class per week for 8 weeks (including examination days) II) 2 classes per week for 8 weeks (including examination days) III) 1 class per week for 16 weeks (including examination days)
Credits	Grades and credits are acquired at the end of each academic semester. According to Kobe University General Rules for Students, 1 credit is usually awarded for 15 hours of lectures. To receive 1 credit, a total of 45 hours of study are required (this includes self-study hours to prepare for or review classwork).
Grading System	5-level grading system: S (90-100), A (80-89), B (70-79), C (60-69), and F (below 59)

Visa Application	Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) In order to support international students' smooth entrance to Kobe University, we offer prospective students a proxy application service for their Certificate of Eligibility (CoE). CoE is issued by immigration before the visa application as evidence that the foreign national meets the conditions for landing in Japan. A foreign national who has a CoE can obtain a visa more easily at an embassy or consulate within the standard processing period. In addition, landing permission will be granted more promptly if students show their CoE to an immigration officer. Kobe University applies for CoE on behalf of incoming students after the issuance of the acceptance letter. The immigration process usually takes about 1 month. Upon successful issue of the CoE, Kobe University mails out an "Acceptance Package", which consists of an acceptance letter and CoE. Students may start their visa application at the Embassy of Japan in their respective countries after receiving this package. However please note that this proxy service does not guarantee 100% success. The final decision for visa issuance rests in the hands of the Japanese Immigration office and Japanese Embassy. *We will send out the acceptance package on the assumption that students will arrive in Japan about 1 week before each semester begins (around the last week of September/March). Students who intend to depart from their country earlier should apply for their visa by themselves without the CoE, since we cannot guarantee that we can issue the CoE earlier than scheduled. However there is no guarantee that the Embassy or Consulate-General of Japan will issue a visa to those applying without a CoE.
	Visa The applicant must apply in person to the Embassy or Consulate-General in their country. Your visa cannot be obtained after arriving in Japan. Kobe University has implemented the Measles and Rubella Registration Policy, and all newly-enrolled Kobe University students must submit a certificate at the medical examination held at Kobe University to show that they have been inoculated against measles and rubella or have received antibody tests. 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Medical Support (medical checkups, physical and mental health consultations)	The Medical Center for Student Health offers emergency first aid treatment, annual medical checkups, and consultations regarding physical or mental health. It can only be used by students and staff of Kobe University. Medical Centers are located in Rokkodai Campus, Fukae Campus, and Kusunoki Campus. New students must take a checkup in either of these months. Students who do not take the free medical examination at Kobe University must take an equivalent medical examination at an external hospital, for which it will be necessary to pay a fee for both the examination and certificate. Then they must present the certificate to the Medical Center for Student Health. *Medical Support Consultation Form For students with chronic conditions and disabilities (physical, developmental, or mental), we will make preparations to provide support where possible if you let us know in advance. If you are taking medication and need help finding continuous treatment in Japan, please let us know using the "Medical Support Consultation Form" before coming to Japan. Support for students with disabilities	At Kobe University each faculty, school, graduate school and the Student Affairs Department provide students with disabilities with the necessary support for their campus life. Global Education Center (GEC)

What is GEC?

The GCE, formerly known as the International Student Center (FY1993 - FY2015) and the Center for International Education (FY 2016-FY2021), was established in April 1993 as a research/teaching facility for all international students across Kobe university. Responsible for the overall needs of international students, the Center provides lessons in Japanese language and Japanese studies, advice on studying and living in Japan, as well as advice in internships and careers, and alumni networking.



NEWS Exchange Students to Kobe University!

From Fall 2022, the GEC is on the list of affiliated schools that exchange students may enroll at!

Any international student enrolled at Kobe University can take a Japanese language course offered at the GEC, but **students belonging to the center will have several advantages**. E.g.,

- ✓ Guidance by GEC academic staff, experts in Japanese language and culture.
- ✓ More opportunities for hands-on experience for Japanese culture and exchange with local Japanese people
- ✓ Support by Japanese students of Kobe university

Eligibility:

- Exchange students majoring Japanese language or Japanese Studies at their home universities
- Exchange students who wish to prioritize studying Japanese language and culture during their stay in Kobe University

NOTE: The Japanese language courses offered by the GEC (excluding those of 'Japanese language/Japanese Studies classes') are NOT credit-bearing. Those who wish transferring credit should make sure about the requirement with their home university in advance. For more information, visit our website.
