

The Kobe University Libraries have a collection of about 3.7 million print materials and 26 thousand titles of electronic journals. The Library for Social Sciences is the oldest and largest of the 9 library branches. A striking mural depicting 25 full-sized figures on the second floor, titled "Seishun" (Youth) welcomes visitors, accompanied by stained-glass skylights in an art-deco style. "The Earthquake Disaster Materials Collection (EDMC)" located within the library holds over 50 thousand materials related to the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake,

Center for International Education (Kobe University Centennial Hall)



The Center for International Education provides Japanese courses for international students and study-abroad consultations for Japanese students. The International Department is also located in the Center, and international students and faculty can stop by the office for support in their studies and daily lives. Kobe University Centennial Hall was built to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the University and designed by Professor KANO Tadamasa, former professor at the Graduate School of Engineering. The design is characterized by large eaves which resemble a bird flying away from the hill. Visitors can enjoy panoramic views overlooking Osaka bay.

Shindai-Ningenhattatsu-Kankyougaku-Kenkyuka-Mae 神大人間発達環境学研究科前



Japanese 'sukiva' style architecture. It is a reconstruction of the house of a famous haiku poet, Mr. YAMAGUCHI Seishi. Visitors can encounter traditional Japanese culture through his haiku and related materials in its exhibition rooms. Although Mr. YAMAGUCH Seishi was not an alumni of Kobe University, he donated all rights of his works, lands and properties to Kobe University, with the hopes that Kobe University would become a research base for haiku.

Idemitsu Sazo Memorial

Rokkodai Auditorium (Registered Tangible Cultural Property)

GOAL

The Idemitsu Sazo Memorial Rokkodai

Auditorium was built in an elegant, medieval omanesque-style in 1935 as the auditorium for the old Kobe University of Commerce. In 2009 Kobe University received generous funding for repair works from Idemitsu Kosa

Co., Ltd, The University expressed its gratitud by naming the building after the company's

founder Idemitsu Sazo (a 1909 Kobe University of Commerce graduate). It is used for official

Uribo Road is the University's inner road from the Graduate School of Engineering to the Graduate School of Intercultural Studies, covered by a wooden deck. Uribo means "wild boar piglet" in Japanese, and it's also Kobe University's official mascot, If you're lucky, you may be able to find some cute uribo near the road or at other places around campus.

Research Center for Advanced Membrane

The Research Center for Advanced Membrane Technology was built in 2015 as the first center for membrane research in Japan. The

Center aims to establish an international hub for membrane engineering technology, and it covers a wide range of research and development from highly functional membranes and films to novel processes for producing them with the aid of material chemistry and chemical engineering. The outside of the building features a geometric design representing membranes, fitted with LEDs which



Kobe Luminarie is a light festival held in downtown Sannomiya every December. Beautifully designed wooden frames with hundreds of thousands of lights in different colors are displayed along the streets and in Higashi Yuenchi park. The event was first held in 1995 to encourage and hearten the people in Kobe in the wake of the Great Hanshin-Awaji earthquake, which occurred earlier in the same year. Oji Zoo, one of the three large zoos in the Kansai area, houses 793 animals from 137 species including many rare animals such as a giant panda, koala bears, Amur tigers, and snow leopards. K computer was designed as the highest caliber of supercomputers in the world and is being used in a broad range of fields including drug discovery, earthquake/ tsunami research, weather forecasting, space science, manufacturing and material development at RIKEN. Kobe University researchers enjoy the privilege of access to this supercomputer for their research.

Ikuta Shrine is one of the oldest shrines in the country and its founding is noted in the Nihon Shoki (the second oldest book of classical Japanese history); it's said to have been constructed by the Empress Jingu at the beginning of the 3rd century AD. Located in Sannomiya, the city center area of Kobe, the shrine is a popular location for young couples to pray for their happiness and to hold wedding

As a hub of the Kobe transportation network: JR, Hanshin and Hankyu railways, Kobe municipal metro and Portllner, Sannomiya is the center of Kobe and has a lively downtown area packed with businesses and public buildings, department stores, and cultural facilities.
