

The Faculty of Law at Kobe University aims to develop individuals who are equipped with a broad educational foundation with in-depth knowledge of law and political science, who have problem solving skills that can respond to the specialized demands of our society today, and who can play an active role in the fields of law and political science in the future.

In order to achieve these objectives, the Faculty has established the following policies for conferring the Bachelor of Law, based on the University's policy for conferring degrees.

1. In addition to the competencies specified in Kobe University's degree conferment policy, the Faculty has set the following abilities and skills as learning objectives:

- in-depth knowledge and expertise in law;
- in-depth knowledge and expertise in political science;
- the ability to acknowledge and respect diverse values and ideas in order to comprehend and assess problems in the fields of law and politics; and
- the ability to generate new ideas by thinking comprehensively in order to solve complex problems.

2. The Faculty requires students to fulfill the following graduation requirements for the conferring of the Bachelor of Law: completing the prescribed period of enrollment at the University, earning the credits stipulated in the Faculty regulations, and achieving the learning objectives set by the University and the Faculty.
