Faculty of Medicine, Kobe University School of Medicine organizes and implements its educational programs in accordance with the following policies, based on the policy for conferring degrees established by the School and the policy on the organization and implementation of curricula set by Kobe University.

- 1. The School offers the Liberal Arts Courses in order to develop a broad and deep education and a comprehensive capacity for judgment, to cultivate a rich sense of humanity, and to achieve the common aim of learning for all students at the University.
- 2. The School offers specialized courses to cultivate deep academic knowledge and advanced professional skills, enabling students to achieve the university-wide learning objectives as well as the learning objectives set by each Faculty. These objectives include "courtesy and attitude," "scientific curiosity," "knowledge and skills," "ethics," "ambition," "leadership," and "internationality."

Courses in basic medicine, basic clinical and interdisciplinary subjects, general medicine, transitional education, integrated practice, elective subjects, and clinical medicine tutorials are offered.

- 3. Classes are conducted through lectures, seminars, experiments, practical training, hands-on practice, or a combination of these methods.
- 4. Academic performance is evaluated using a multidimensional and comprehensive approach aligned with the learning objectives, based on written exams, practical exams, reports, participation, and presentation content.
